### SAFETY PLAN

Due to the presence of COVID-19 it is necessary for the SGAS to take steps to protect our members. Members intending to visit the Society's venues must, prior to visiting, acquaint themselves with an up-to-date list of COVID-19 NSW case locations. Locations are listed on the NSW Health Website <https://www.nsw.gov.au/covid-19/latest-news-and-updates>. Members must not visit any of our venues if they have been to any of the listed locations on the specified times and dates.

The following are the current guidelines for the venues currently being used:

#### **Kogarah School of Arts:**

Advice from the Georges River Council is:

- *Please keep a 1.5m distance from other guests while in the venue.*
- *A limit to the number of guests we can accommodate to each venue.*
- *Please regularly wash your hands for at least 20 seconds and use hand sanitiser. Increased the cleaning and sanitising schedules of venues.*
- *GRC have increased the cleaning and sanitising schedules of venues.*

**SGAS** is currently using the Kogarah School of Arts for daytime activities only. Safety precautions are in place with attendance records and contact details. Tables and chairs are set according to social distancing requirements. Sanitisers are provided and paper towels and single use cups and cutlery are used. The wearing of masks is encouraged.

#### **Georges River 16ft Sailing Club:**

The club has provided the following advice:

- *"Everyone must remain seated, we have a covid marshal who ensures social distancing is being practiced.*
- *People who are from areas deemed as a 'hot spot' are not permitted to enter.*
- *We are registered with the NSW government for being a Covid safe business and have had the inspectors through. They were more than happy with the safety plan we have in place."*

**SGAS** : Critiques and Demonstrations will continue as scheduled at the Sailing Club, however the appropriate safety precautions must be adhered to. At Demonstrations and Critiques, seating will be arranged to ensure physical distancing is in place as recommended by the Government. Our meetings are currently restricted to 15 members only because of social isolation requirements. Attending members are asked to write their names and contact details when entering the Club, in compliance of public health issues. Sanitisers are provided and the wearing of masks is encouraged.
