# **MEMBERS ANNUAL ART AWARD 2023 – Judge DARIO FALZON**



Mitzi Tilley Award for Excellence

Artist: Salwa Woodroffe

Title: Austinmer Headland and Beyond

Medium: oil on canvas

Judge's comments:

This piece showcases the artists accomplished understanding of drawing, tone and colour; It is vibrant and alive. The contrasts in brushwork throughout the painting support a firm grasp of the creation of depth and aerial perspective. While the use of colour and its contrasting temperature relationships is handled to masterful effect. The tonal structure pulls all this together completing a compelling piece that deserves recognition.

Section 1— Wal Chandler Award for oil painting

Winner: John Poole

Title: Carss Park History and Shadows

Judge's comments:

A beautiful piece that captures the feel and movement of a late afternoon by the water. The lively brushwork and exposed underpainting create a sense of immediacy and the composition draws the viewers eye and keeps it engaged on the focal point.

A wonderful use of a restrained, complementary colour palette, creating an overall warm harmony. A strong composition guides the eye throughout the painting always ensuring the viewer never lingers too long on one thing and always leads back to the focal point and the clever use of reflection to include the vase of flowers.

#### Judge's comments:

The strong horizontal movement combined with well placed vertical shapes and dark contrasts, creates a sense of rhythm and depth out of a suburban setting. The piece is well balanced, and repetition of shapes and angles is used to great effect.






S5 Highly Commended:

#### Judge's comments:

Bold contrasts and colour shapes, create an intimate still-life and elevate what could be an otherwise mundane interior scene. There's a sense of mystery here, created by the tension between the dark foreground and the light coming in from outside. The blackbird on the desk creates a focal point that is supported by the subtle arrangement of colour shapes.

Section 7—Muriel Harding Portrait Award

Winner: Salwa Woodroffe

Medium: oil

Judge's comments:

A strong blue colour harmony lends this portrait with an ethereal quality. The eyes create a strong focal point supported by the leading lines of the hair and the well-placed diagonal movement of the jellyfish. The upward gaze of the subject helps to create movement for the viewer to let their eyes wander up and around the painting.

Section 8—Dowman Family Miniatures Award

Medium: Mixed Media

#### Judge's comments:

This beautiful miniature balances both tonal and colour contrast, with a composition that leads the viewer's eye through the trees, stepping out of the cool shadows into the warm light of the middle distance. This play between light and dark, cool and warm, vertical and horizontal movement creates a sense of depth and mystery.

Judge's comments:

A wonderful little study in human anatomy, that captures the character of the subject. The rhythm of the linework, the abstract use of colour and the considered positioning of the second individual in profile creates interest and movement.
