I've always loved to travel the world, starting when I was twenty one, before the explosion of tourists that is happening now. It was a quieter time then, when I and my husband took off for a three month trip to England, Europe and Asia. At the time I worked in the photography industry. Always taking photos, some for reference to use for paintings. Over the years, I attended various painting workshops in Bali, Vietnam, USA, Italy and Morocco. A standout was watercolourist, Charles Reid in a workshop in California. During those trips I often picked up souvenirs in markets and junk shops, which I have used in my still life paintings. Here is a painting I created a few years ago based on photos of Speakers Corner in London for those old enough to remember. (pic 4) And another in Florence at a market place when I lived there for a few weeks after retiring. (Pic 2) After a trip to Bali, I held my first solo show and a number of solo and group shows after that. I've always loved travelling, often on a tight budget, which has been interesting, as I have stayed

in places more where the locals lived, rather than in five star hotels. Years ago I took a photo of a cat on a window sill in Latvia, and eventually sold the painting which I only completed from a reference photo last year. (Pic 5) One of my most memorable trips was to South Africa a few years ago and I painted this watercolour of Mariners Wharf. A photo of me painting in Hoi An, Vietnam, one of my favourite places. (Pic 3) Travelling came to an end just over five years ago, after a printmaking workshop in Bali with the fabulous Shana James. I was diagnosed with

stage 4 ovarian cancer and was lucky it was found, accidently. Still undergoing treatment, but other complications have put a pause on getting out and about. I can honestly say though, my art has helped me tremendously through treatments in the hospital. I always had a brush in my hand and a travel watercolour kit for the hours of chemo, which helped me to think positively. Always a huge thank you for my medical team and wonderful nurses at Chris O'Brien Life house.


Great work achieved at Portraiture with our so interesting model, Alicia.

We had a 20minute sessions which is so good to concentrate on work. A great attendance and enjoyed by all. Special thank you to Paul who helped me with setting up.










Here are hands and faces at sketching yesterday. Great work was the result from our loyal members who braved the bad weather to be there. The results show how good the group are becoming.

Jenny's work is symbolic, evocative, and features many dramatic, expressive forms. Extensive use is made of Ying and Yang, positive and negative spaces. Natural and abstract patterns are also featured, to stir the intellect and awaken passion in the viewer.

In China she was a professional artist, teacher and designer in Shanghai. Since arriving in Australia 1989, Jenny has completed an Honours BVA and Master of Art Degree in Sydney College of the Arts, University of Sydney.

As a professional artist, she has specialised in portraiture, sketching, design and printmaking. She was awarded a High Commendation (in traditional printing) at Liverpool Powerhouse Museum 2001, also win the logo design competition for Discovery Festival of the Arts Hurstville winner for 2004.
